The 11th annual Gopher Dairy Camp was held June 7th-9th on the University of Minnesota St. Paul Campus. 82 youth in grades 6-10 from Minnesota, Iowa, Wisconsin and Michigan took part in the three day camp where they had the opportunity to gain skills in showing dairy cattle, further their knowledge about the dairy industry, and make new friendships.

Camp kicked off with the participants competing in Minute to Win it games. Campers were able to meet the other members of their group and also earn Moo Money to be used in the Gopher Gold Auction later that evening where they purchased the calf they would use for the rest of camp.

Monday began with workshops where campers learned about preparing for county fair from Katie Schmitt, Dairy Nutrition from Isaac Salfer, and showmanship from Eric Sonnek. Dr. Bob Horton from Ohio State University also returned to camp this year to teach campers about the science and history behind many dairy products. After lunch, group fitting demonstrations were held with professional fitters followed by the campers trying their hand at fitting their calves. The day ended with a trip to the Twins Ballpark to enjoy a night filled with baseball and wonderful weather.



Tuesday started bright and early with campers preparing for the showmanship contest. The showmanship contest was held in the Livestock Pavilion on St. Paul Campus with Staci Sexton and Megan Herberg as our judges. Following the showmanship contest Rebekah LaBerge held a workshop focusing on calf nutrition and care. The campers received a private tour of TCF Bank Stadium and were able to go down on the football field. Camp ended with an awards banquet that included a keynote speech from Jeni Haler, recognition of the top showmen, camp awards, and door prizes.

2015 National Dairy Challenge

The 2015 National Dairy Challenge Contest and the North American Intercollegiate Dairy Challenge Academy were hosted by the North East Region in Syracuse, NY. Led by advisor Dr. Marcia Endres, the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities brought a team of four students to the contest and eight students to the Academy.

In its 3rd year, the Academy has been steadily growing in popularity. It is a program designed for sophomores and juniors to prepare them for Dairy Challenge contests. Academy participants are put into teams consisting of 6-8 students from different colleges and two industry advisors. The blended teams look over a farm's records and visit the operation together to prepare a short presentation on the farm's strengths and opportunities. Group advisors and other students are then able to ask questions of the team and have a discussion about the farm.

The Dairy Challenge team visited one of four competition farms, reviewed its records, visited with owners and employees, and built a professional presentation to give to the judges, all between Thursday evening and Saturday afternoon. Although the University of Minnesota's team was not selected as a winner, the team felt confident in their insights on the farm, and that they learned from participating in the contest.

The event featured several additional learning opportunities. Students heard from a panel on beginning a dairy from a young college graduate's perspective, a panel on dairy processing with professionals from DFA, Chobani, a small cheese maker and a milk bottling startup. There were several different "mini" classes for students to attend on topics from activity monitors to NDF content in corn silage. Students also toured one of upstate New York's large farms on the first day of the event, to get a feel for dairy farming in the region. The event had a career fair with some of the country's premier dairy and animal business employers.

All in all, the 2015 Dairy Challenge was a success and a great learning opportunity for University of Minnesota students and Gopher Dairy Club members!




Eric plans to work in the dairy genetics field before returning home to his family's dairy farm.
